Who We Are



Fraser Region Community Justice Initiatives Association (CJI) is a community-based non-profit society located in Langley, British Columbia, Canada. The organization has more than 20 years of experience in providing conflict resolution services in such settings as the criminal justice system, workplace, community, institutions, organizations, churches, schools and businesses, and for private individuals. First organized through efforts of the Langley Mennonite Fellowship, CJI has since grown into a multifaceted organization.

CJI operates under a Restorative Justice framework: Crime and conflict result in harm done to persons. Restorative Justice seeks to heal and put right the wrongs. Focus is on the needs of those who have been harmed and of those responsible for the harm. Accountability, healing and closure are encouraged for all concerned. To that end, CJI has pioneered and administered programs and processes that result in meaningful, satisfying outcomes for variety of conflict situations and situations of harm.

What We Do

Programs & Services

CJI operates a range of restorative programs and services for those impacted by situations ranging from schoolyard trouble, to youth offences, to the most serious crimes in the Canadian Criminal Code. Conciliation, mediation, conferencing, and facilitated therapeutic dialogue are among the processes used. CJI's programs include:

- **The Victim Offender Mediation Program (VOMP)**, designed to meet the need for healing and closure in people affected by the most serious crimes in the Canadian Criminal Code.
- **Educating for Peacebuilding**, working toward changing the culture in Langley schools and addressing the underlying causes of conflict.

- **Restorative Youth Services**, operating in partnership with Pacific Community Resources Society (Surrey) and Family and Youth Services Society (Langley), providing restorative services to youth in the form of Community Service, Community Capacity Development and Mentorship.

One of CJI's core programs for more than 20 years, the **Victim Offender Reconciliation Program (VORP)** was suspended in 2004 when government funding was terminated. While the program is longer operational, the principles upon which it was based are fundamental to CJI's philosophy.

CJI also offers conflict resolution services and training tailored to the needs of organizations, businesses and individuals in a wide variety of settings and situations. Processes and training workshops are specifically designed around the circumstances of the conflict or need.
